












At the end of 2019, we launched a communication campaign, during which employees could subscribe to a specific itinerary. **Two were proposed from Annecy and the Pays de Gex**. Employees also had the opportunity to propose other itineraries.

Unfortunately, the pandemic halted this launch and shuttles in other industrial areas also had to be suspended temporarily. ### **CAMPAIGN TO PROMOTE ACTIVE MODES OF TRANSPORT**

#### AND THE LÉMAN EXPRESS

No campaign nor any activities could have been organized during Spring 2020, as most of us were confined at home and teleworking. As the strict regulations were slowly eased, we communicated on the **advantages and drawbacks of various modes of transport** in this particular situation, which you can find here.

During the Fall, the Léman Express began operating at its normal schedule. We published <u>another</u> <u>document</u> about the advantages of walking, cycling, peripheral parking, and the Léman Express. We were also lucky to have been able to plan a workshop with Dupont on the use of various active modes, which participants enjoyed attending.























Following the launch of the Léman Express, substantial modifications needed to be made to the ZIMEYSA, Meyrin, and Vernier train stations in order to improve access to the platforms and modernize the current infrastructures.

Work has been completed at the ZIMEYSA station, while it is almost completed at the Meyrin station, whereas construction will continue at the Vernier station until 2022. Train traffic is not impacted for this year.

Starting in 2023, a bus transitway will be completed between the Cornavin train station and the Hôpital de La Tour, transiting via the Nant d'Avril Road.

Lastly, changes were made to the TPG network, which has **improved the accessibility** to the zone:

- Bus 68 route has been extended between CERN and Blandonnet (increase of 28% of the offer)
- Buses 56 and 57 will now pass every 15mn and their schedule has been synchronized with the train.

#### **GREEN WAY AND BIKE SHARING SYSTEM**



The population was consulted on the future itinerary of the "voie verte d'agglomération", which will go through the ZIMEYSA and Satigny.

Information was sent to the ZIMEYSA employees and mobility administrators responsible within companies.

The consultation included:

- An online survey between June 10th and 30th, addressed to anyone interested by the project
- Workshops on September 15th to collect feedback and needs, as well as to offer details about the upcoming itinerary
- A session to summarize the workshops' and survey's results on November 14th

On August 18th, the official bikesharing system of Geneva, VéloPartage, was inaugurated across the canton. Through the Donkey Republic app, users are able to reserve and unlock a bicycle in one of the 120 stations spread throughout downtown and the adjacent communes.
